

## WHAT DO WE SHARE FROM WEEK TO WEEK?

Again, for this month I have copied these pages from "The Group Reunion" handbook from the Upper Room. The two following sections explain questions from the group reunion card that each person received on his or her "Walk". I sincerely pray that these explanations have given each group a fresh approach to necessary and tough weekly questions.

### Call to Discipleship

At what moment during this week did you feel you were responding to God's call to be a disciple? Where did you participate in being the Church this week?

The message of the Walk to Emmaus is that God loves each of us with an unconditional love that our discipleship consists in sharing that gift of love with others. In reviewing the service sheet, we share how we followed through on our planned commitments to Christian action. In the "Call to Discipleship", we examine our awareness and responsiveness to God's call of love in the midst of everyday life. When did we help someone become open to God's love? When do we reach out to a friend in need or go out of our way for

someone we did not even know?

The question invites us, first of all, to think positively about the ways we responded faithfully to God's call to love, witness, and service during the past week. Responsiveness to God's call of love often comes naturally. When Jesus came as a stranger to the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, they received him without question into their company. When they arrived at Emmaus, they invited him to stay over and to share their food.

By naming even those ways in which our discipleship comes naturally, we celebrate the ways in which God's grace is active already in who we are. Discipleship is seldom a rare and heroic deed. It is, at its best, a lifestyle of grace that expresses itself in everything we do.

The question also challenges us to reflect upon the ways God may be beckoning us to share Christ's love in a new and unanticipated ways. Which persons continually surface in prayer and thought? What human need continues to interrupt our peace? What injustice keeps us awake at night? Sometimes faithful response requires planning and collaboration with others. Some-

times it means changing our plans. Sometimes it means sacrifice. Sometimes it means finally forgiving someone or seeking forgiveness in a relationship that needs healing.

#### **Discipleship Denied**

When was your faith tested this week through failure?

This question has two sides. First, the question invites us to review ways in which our best efforts as disciples were denied, obstructed, or rendered fruitless during the past week. For example, the crucifixion of Jesus clearly reflected the world's denial of Jesus' and the disciples' ministry. Apparent failure tested their faith. But what did God accomplish through, or in spite of, their failure? What did they learn about following Jesus and about the walk of faith?

Jesus' journey with his disciples makes it clear that the experience of failure is inherent in the call to discipleship. We find our faith tested when persons reject our efforts at reconciliation, take advantage of our attempts at generosity, do not return our investments of love and energy, and disregard our attempts to witness.

## From the Spiritual Director . .

Hello beautiful Emmaus people!

Norman A. McMurry tells about a palace in the city of Rome which has a great high dome. Inside that dome there is a painting known as The Dawn by Guido Reni. In order that the visitors may see this masterpiece, a table has been placed directly beneath the dome, and on the table a mirror. When one looks into the mirror, they see the majestic painting far above.

That's what the incarnation is all about! Jesus Christ is the "mirror-image" of God. Sent by Christ, the Holy Spirit is God's incarnation (Cleansing agent) that begins a thorough work in cleaning our mirror and what we reflect. It's here that we must understand something about image.

Yes, we as Christians, members of particular denominations, and our Emmaus community are made "image-conscious" by the Holy Spirit, but we can become frustrated in the quest of trying to imitate Christ if we don't understand the principle of "rest".

David Wilkerson writes that Hudson Taylor, a great man of God and missionary to China in the mid-1800's, ministered in that capacity for many years without joy. He was "downcast over his struggles, agonizing over secret longings and thoughts of unbelief". The key to his knowing joy in the midst of the blessing of God's incarnation, was learning to rest in Jesus' promise of continual union with him. Taylor wrote his sister of his breakthrough: "God sees me as dead and buried at the Cross, where Christ died for me. And now He asks me to see myself as He sees me. So I rest in the victory that His blood won for me, and I count it so. I am as capable of sinning as ever; but now I see Christ with me as never before. As I confess my sins quickly; I believe they are instantly pardoned."

We know the familiar tune "I'm proud to be an American....." I'm prouder to be an imitator of God in Christ Jesus as a pastor, father, husband, part of a wonderful Emmaus Community, but joy

is found by searching out Christ's promises for change, reciting them, and personalizing them by faith. I think that's what Jesus meant when He said in John 15.8: "By Abiding in me the Father is glorified and you shall bear much fruit, and so prove to be my disciples."

Only those who never try to follow Jesus avoid failure. And yet, the potential in these experiences is to grow in grace though adversity. God uses failure when we give it over in faith. Christ teaches us the meaning of the call to faithfulness, not success. We learn to surrender the fruit of our actions to God.

Another side of the question of discipleship denied is the naming of the ways in which we failed to be responsive to God's call to love and service during the past week. Like Peter, we stood by warming ourselves at the fire while truth was being crucified. (See Luke 18:25) Like the rich young rules, we were unable to respond to love's call with the necessary commitment. The aim is not to beat up on ourselves but to become aware of our "no" to God and resistances to grace that are still active in all of our lives. We acknowledge the ways in which Christ's perfect love does not yet reign in our lives. We identify opportunities for further growth in the love and likeness of Jesus Christ.
