

From the *Good Shepherd* . . .

I copied this article out of the L.O.V.E. Newsletter available after my Walk. It is as relevant today as it was then:

The following article is just part of "The Group Reunion" book published by the Upper Room for the Walk to Emmaus.

"Two routes are available for joining a group. Either you may seek out a group that is already in process or you may seek out friends to form a new group. Joining a group requires personal initiative and prayer. While persons are ready to assist you, NO ONE WILL AUTOMATICALLY MATCH YOU WITH A GROUP.

Group reunions represent a step of faith on the part of people who are taking personal responsibility for their lives as Christians with the help of the Holy Spirit. Emmaus groups form most naturally among friends or among persons who already have some basis of relationship, such as the Emmaus experience, membership in the same church, or simply a common desire to be more intentional about one's Christian discipleship. Each of these is a solid foundation for building an accountability group.

Expect some change in the membership of group reunions. Members move away, secure new jobs, get married, have babies, transfer churches, alter schedules, undergo crisis, and change as persons. The combination of external factors that make some groups possible may change, making the same groups impossible a few years down the road. Sometimes persons may change groups for personal reasons - to start new groups, to join a group with a person who shares similar goals or needs, to get a fresh start apart from difficult past relationships. No one needs to feel obligated to stay in the same group forever.

When you are having trouble joining a group, pray that the Spirit open your eyes to potential companions among the people around you. Call on those persons who can offer assistance: your sponsor, your table leader from your Emmaus weekend, the Good Shepherd in the Emmaus Community, and your

pastor or other church staff." The Group Reunion, Walk to Emmaus, the Upper Room

Step up, step forward and join or begin a new group!

Speaking through Serving ...

Greetings, LOVEmmaus Community!! We're finally getting to the fifth installment from the book, "The Five Love Languages" by Dr. Gary Chapman. As a guick review, Dr. Chapman through years of marriage counseling identified what he calls "five love languages." The big theme that runs through the entire book is that each of us has a primary love language that has developed in us based on how God wired us in the beginning, and the experiences of our lives. Other people seeking to show us love must speak in our language, or we do not recognize it as love. There is a communication barrier, so to speak, and we can completely miss the love intended behind the act. Dr. Chapman tells us that we must be tuned in to the primary love language of the one we are trying to love. Think about the implications of this as we try to love each other as the body of Christ!

The fourth love language described by Dr. Chapman is <u>Acts of Service</u>. Acts of service means doing things your spouse would like you to do. You seek to please by serving; you express your love by doing things for your spouse.

"Chores" done with a positive spirit can be an expression of love. Even the types of service can be different dialects...it is important to find the acts that make your spouse feel loved. Examples include cooking a meal, setting a table, washing dishes, vacuuming, cleaning a commode, getting hairs out of the sink, removing the white spots from the mirror, getting bugs off the windshield, taking out the garbage, changing the baby's diaper, painting a bedroom, dusting the bookcase, keeping the car in operating condition, washing or vacuuming the car, cleaning the garage, mowing the grass, trimming the shrubs, raking the leaves, dusting the blinds, walking the dog, changing the cat's litter box, and changing water in the goldfish bowl.

Acts of service take thought, time, planning, and effort. Paul told us to, "Serve one another in love." Jesus gave us a beautiful example when He washed the feet of the disciples.

Requests can give direction in love, but demands stop the flow of love. Acts of service must be <u>chosen</u>, not demanded. It is interesting to note that what we do for each other before marriage is no indication of what we will do after marriage. A spouse's criticisms about your behavior provide the clearest clue to their primary love language.

The heart of Emmaus is Acts of Service, but these acts are often anonymous to the casual observer...and this is intended by the very tenets of the Emmaus movement...to serve anonymously. But the Acts of Service are there, from time spent in prayer and team meetings, to cleaning and preparing the campground or planning, cooking, serving and cleaning up after meals, as well as many other activities before, during and after a Walk. In addition, many Acts of Service are required to run the Community and host Gatherings. To those people whose primary love language is Acts of Service, an Emmaus Community can certainly speak their language!
