
Thanks to all who helped in the kitchen the week-end of the Men's Walk, especially to Tim Ratcliff who was wonderful help all weekend long.

Some years ago a man by the name of Charles Hummel wrote a magazine article entitled: "The Tyranny of the Urgent." He says, "We live in constant tension between the "urgent" and the "important". The problem is that the important task rarely has to be done today, or this week or even this year. Tasks like Bible study, prayer, a note or visit to a friend or the careful study of a good book are important but not urgent." Because our lives are so filled with the urgent, the important waits and waits and waits...!

The momentary appeal of the "urgent" becomes irresistible so that our energy and life become dissipated on what was not all that important. An understanding of time and eternity tell us that there is nothing more important than our relationship with Jesus Christ our Lord. He says at John 15:5, "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing."

Let's forgo as much of the "urgent" as possible so that we may be obedient in fulfilling the "important" tasks of abiding in Him and bearing fruit.

A Biblical Peter Principle

What God did through the Apostle Peter encourages me. Maybe it's because his personality and mine are similar. I think the three words I use most are, "I'm so sorry."

We are both frequently loud. In John 13, As Jesus washed His disciples' feet, Peter proclaims "you shall never wash my feet (13:8)." I once told a woman I wanted to get to know I didn't recognize her after not seeing her for several months - no wonder she later said she was uncomfortable around me. We both speak first and think later. At the Transfiguration in Matthew 17, Peter, James and John had just seen Jesus speak with Moses and Elijah, and Peter wants to build three shelters.

And we both wear our emotions on our sleeves, on our shoes, on our coats and socks (maybe Peter didn't have socks; work with me here). Sometimes I can be aggravatingly thin-skinned. But Peter is also the one who twice says of Jesus, "You are the Christ."

One more thing: First Peter 1:3 says, "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead ..." Peter teaches that God's "great mercy" is also a bunch of little mercies available to us.

Since God used the sometimes arrogant, frequently crude fisherman who denied Christ three times to teach great truths of His love and forgiveness, He can also use us today when we let Him. That's encouraging.
