Rich in HISTORY ... and BLESSINGS !
This year I have been reading the letters and correspondence of the early Community Leaders and the folks from the Upper Room. I had forgotten how much work had gone into our becoming a "Walking"

Community". We sought the Lord's leading in everything. I remember being in a group that was praying for the location of the Walks. We had been given three names and after much prayer we all agreed that Ruggles Campground was where God was leading. I smile when I hear Pilgrims say that Ruggles feels like Holy Ground. Perhaps that is because of its past.

For any of you who don't know, the camp was founded in 1873. In 1923, for the 50th anniversary, an estimated 10,000 (yes, ten thousand!!) people gathered to hear the gospel preached. Some rode trains from Cincinnati to Maysville to attend. It was the spiritual highlight of the year for the surrounding counties.

In early days, three services were held daily. Over 70 cottages surrounded the Tabernacle. A large hotel and several dormitories were available for overnight guests. Many slept in tents or under wagons.

When you think of all the preaching and prayers that were heard there, you understand why it is, indeed, "Holy Ground".

I had the great privilege of hearing Rich Mullins sing at the ICTHTHUS music festival in April of 1997. I immediately became a huge fan. I remember we were near the stage and his humility and graciousness made us all feel like we were enjoying a time of intimate worship with a close friend.

Just a few months later Rich Mullins was killed in a horrible car crash. I have since read a book about his life and continued to use his music as an aid to my worship. So many of his songs are laden with a message straight from the Word of God. It's hard to pick out my favorite but one that truly touches my heart is entitled "While the Nations Rage," and is based on Psalm 2:1. Let me share some of the words with you:

Where are the nails that pierced his hands? Well the nails have turned to rust, but behold the Man, He has risen, and He reigns in the hearts of the children rising up in His name. Where are the thorns that drew his blood? Well the thorns have turned to dust, but not so the love He has given, It remains in the hearts of the children who will love, while the nations rage.

What will last? Jesus is risen and will reign forever and He wants to be recognized by the love He has planted in the hearts of His chosen ones, the ones who were chosen before the creation of the world according to Ephesians 1:4.

The weapons of destruction, both those used to draw the blood of our Savior and those used to destroy our souls, will someday cease to exist. The nations and the individuals of the world go to extreme lengths to get their way, to get the things that will bring them 'contentment', but the only thing that will truly satisfy forever, to all eternity, is our relationship with Jesus Christ. Psalm 2:4 says, "*The One enthroned in Heaven laughs; the Lord scoffs at them.*"

The things we chase after, spending countless hours and untold sums of money, are laughable to God. They will soon turn to dust and rust and we will be left with empty hands.
