Emmaus Is Cloistered

"Emmaus is a time apart from the world. For three days, participants break from their usual routine in order to experience living in Christian community and to be immersed in a New Testament perspective on life. Just as if the participants had withdrawn to a distant monastery for a weekend of prayer and reflection, they are asked to stay onsite for the entire three days under the spiritual direction of the Emmaus team to make no contact by phone or otherwise with the outside world, and to have no expectation of getting some homework done in their spare time. Emmaus events are usually held in retreat centers or church facilities large enough to have kitchen and sleeping accommodations for about sixty people." The Upper Room Handbook, p. 6

"Cloister" may be a new word to some. It simply means to be secluded or set apart from the world and worldly cares. On an Emmaus Walk, Pilgrims are cloistered with conference team members who are responsible for guiding them on a spiritual journey drawing them into a closer relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. For this to happen it takes many, many in background support roles serving both team members and Pilgrims. For instance, prayer servants and logistic persons who are very important team members stay in the background. What could be done without the kitchen staff and servers? Less desirable jobs include cleaning the bathrooms and putting out the trash. All are important to make the weekend as pleasant as possible for the Pilgrims. It is being willing to serve in these servant capacities that pave the way to the more desirable positions of serving on the conference team as table leaders and lay directors. (Cont'd on page 3)

The important thing is for those participating in the supporting servant roles to allow the conference team members under the direction of the Holy Spirit quide the Pilgrims during the times they are in the conference room and in the sanctuary. Hello Beautiful Emmaus people! During my teenage years in Dyer, Tennessee, the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and the United Methodist Church would from time to time have joint revival services. There was a man, Junior Nicholson, who you could always count on to liven up the services. He would raise his hands as well as shout "Amen" or "Glory!" I would wonder how in the world he knew when to lift his hands, or interject those words, and what it meant. Junior has since gone to be with the Lord, but unknowingly he passed something on to me. It was a search for what he "saw" through the eyes of the Holy Spirit. How we react, in word and deed, is a product of what we see through new eyes of the Holy Spirit. There is no cause for hopelessness or alarm at anytime when we are seeing through those eyes!

In Matthew 14.13-21, Jesus feeds five thousand with five loaves and two fish. Initially, He said to his disciples, "You feed them!" In verse 16 when they protest, He commanded, "Bring them here to Me." The "rest of the story" was that Jesus transformed a situation from that which seemed hopeless into that which overflowed with blessing.
