Sponsorship: Helpful Hints

We are fast approaching the "walk season" of the L.O.V.E. Community and many of you have already been busy stepping into a sponsorship role as evidenced by the pilgrims registered for the Spring '04 Walks. As chair of Sponsorship for the community I wish to provide practical advice and a caution or two as you shine your light before others in your role as sponsor.

As you prayerfully consider pilgrim candidates remember the purpose of the Walk to Emmaus is to build up leaders in the church. Each of us had such a unique and wonderful experience on the weekend it is only natural for us to want to share this joyous experience with others. In our zeal to share we forget the main purpose of the weekend...to build up leaders for the church. For many, the weekend does provide an unparalleled spiritual experience but it was not created for saving the lost or relieving suffering. It can be very unfair to the team and the pilgrim to place a pilgrim on a walk weekend who is not ready for that experience. Remember... *prayerful consideration*.

Once you have identified a pilgrim candidate, if the pilgrim is married, the Emmaus literature states it is best to approach the pilgrim and the spouse together. This serves to include both in the information and decision process and raises the possibility the spouse will wish to attend the Walk as well. You can attract two pilgrims and only sponsor one as the first spouse attending will be very excited about sponsoring their spouse on a walk weekend. Share your experience with the weekend... the talks, the food, worship, fellowship, etc. Remember there are no secrets on an Emmaus weekend only surprises. There is Emmaus literature available to help with the explanation if needed. First time sponsors are encouraged to read the Emmaus pamphlet entitled "Sponsorship".

The men's team for Walk #8 is finally set and the team will start training on March 25th. The men are really looking forward to the start and would like to ask the entire community to join in prayer for the success of the weekend.

Prayer is the most powerful single element in the training and the weekend. It is also a way for the community as a whole and for each individual to become involved in the Walk To Emmaus weekends. Even if there is no other way for you to serve you can take time out of each day to pray for the teams and the pilgrims.

Pray especially that the weekend will be servant oriented and that the pilgrims will only see Christ when they see the team. There is no "I" on a team. Only we. And you can be part of that team by praying for the weekend.

A note from the Good Shepherd ...

Any time an army goes to war or an expedition takes to the field, it breaks down into little platoons and squads. And every chronicle of war or quest will tell you that the men and women who fought bravely fought for each other. That's where the acts of heroism and sacrifice take place because that's where the devotion is. You simply cannot be devoted to a mass of people; devotion takes place in small units, just as in a family.

"We have stopped short of being an organization; we are an organism instead, a living and spontaneous association of individuals who know one another intimately, care for each other deeply; and feel a kind of respect for one another that makes rules and bylaws unnecessary. A group is the right

> size, I would guess, when each member can pray for every other member, individually and by name." This paragraph was writ

ten by Brother Andrew, who smuggled Bibles into Communist countries.

You *must* have a small fellowship to walk with you and fight with you and bandage your wounds. Remember, the path is narrow, and *few* find it. *Few* means "small in number," as opposed to, say, massive. This is essential. This is what the scriptures urge us to do. First. Foremost. Not as an addition to Sunday. Before anything else.

God is calling together little communities of the heart, to fight for one another and for the hearts of those who have not yet been set free. That camaraderie, that intimacy, that incredible impact by a few stouthearted souls—that is available. It is the Christian life as Jesus gave it to us. It is completely normal.

We pray for God to open the door for the pilgrims He wants and that we would recognize them. We sign up on the 24 hour prayer vigil to pray for each Walk. We commit to serve in some way in our community so that the Kingdom of God can expand on earth and in us.
